If you see Moe in the window and notice she's a bit wobbly - don't worry!

Moe has Cerebellar Hypoplasia (cer·e·bel·lar hy·po·pla·sia), a disorder found in cats and dogs which causes jerky movements, tremors and generally uncoordinated motion - just like ataxic cerebral palsy in humans.

Cats with Cerebellar Hypoplasia are often needlessly euthanased when people wrongly assume the condition is painful and/or contagious. It's neither, and cats

like Moe not only have a normal life expectancy but are also very affectionate, sweet and loving. They return the extra care they need with an intense love for and bond with their adoptive families.
